FAITH DECLARATIONS OF THE MAR THOMA CHURCH

For the sustenance and growth of any community, it is important to have its own history, identity and common values shared by all the members of that community. Church is a community with history, identity and common values or goals. Each member of the community must have in-depth awareness of these in order to participate wholeheartedly in the work of nurturing and building of the Community of God for the Glory of God and for the benefit of entire creation. Let us examine some of the core values and objectives enumerated in the Constitution of the Mar Thoma Syrian Church through the faith proclamation in Part I & II of the Sabha Constitution.

The Name 'Mar Thoma Syrian Church of Malankara' (Part I-Clause I)

Our church is named after St. Thomas, one of the twelve apostles of Jesus Christ, believed to have founded the Church at the Malabar Coast of India. Many people raise questions as to 'why are we calling or addressing ourselves as

Syrian Church or Christians'? The Word 'Syrian' is attributed to the Ancient tradition of our Church. Christianity, as we see today, has emerged from three main traditions: Syrian, Latin (Roman), and Bizantanian (commonly known as Greek Tradition). Syriac or Aramic is considered as the most ancient of all these traditions. They are closer to the Hebraic and Aramic Culture of Ancient Palestine and Jews. Syriac is a dialect of Aramic which was the common language of the people of Palestine or Middle East after the Babylonian exile. Aramic had been the language of the lews during the time of lesus. In the sub-apostolic period, Church Fathers like St. Ephraim wrote their theological interpretation and exhortations in Syriac. The bible used by the ancient Palestine or Middle East was also in Syriac (which is commonly known as Peshita). The Liturgies developed during this period were written in Syriac (either in West Syriac or East Syriac). It is quite obvious that the Church of Malabar (Maliankara or later Malanakara) inherited this great ancient tradition as

the cultural, faith and economic exchanges between Middle East and costal Malabar was strong in the early part of the Christian Era. The name Malankara is added to differentiate between the Syriac Church of Palestine and Syrian Church of Malabar Coast as ours is an indigenous Christian Culture developed in the subcontinent over centuries and it is unique in faith, culture and expression.

The Identity of the Church (Part I: Clause I)

Mar Thoma Church is part of the One Holy, Catholic (Universal), and Apostolic Church as confessed in the Nicene Creed. The Church is Holy, because it is a set apart community for the Divine purpose which belongs to the Holy God. Moreover, it is the arena or force field of Trinitarian God. The presence of Christ and his spirit makes Church Holy. Church is universal or Catholic because the salvation we received through Christ's atoning sacrifice is for all, not exclusively for one race or one nation. All who accept Jesus as Lord and Saviour are God's children and belong to the family of God, irrespective of their caste, colour, creed or race. Church is Apostolic, as the the church is founded on the basis of Apostolic Teaching. Church received the teachings of Jesus through the Apostolic preaching or proclamation. The

Church inherited the blessings of succession or laying on hands from the Apostles. Finally, Church is a called-out-community who is commissioned (sent like an apostle) by Jesus for preaching, teaching ad baptizing (i.e., the Apostolic Mission of the Church -Matthew 28:18-20).

Worship of God in Trinity (Part I - Clause 2)

Our Church believes in the Trinitarian God and Christ centered life. Christian church since its establishment, holds firm the affirmation that God is Trinity and Jesus is an incarnation of the second person of Trinity for the purpose of redemption of humankind. It is through Jesus that mystery of Trinity or Godhead is revealed to us.

The Trinitarian understanding of God has great significance to the faith and life of the church and its members. There is a saying that, 'what you worship that you become'. Our God is one, but he is in three persons. It doesn't mean that they are three gods. They are three personalities of one and the same God. Three personalities of God give emphasis to the communitarian aspect of Godhead (as in Genesis 1:26 & John 17:21) He lives in community of three persons and there is no hierarchy in their relationship. 'Mutual indwelling' (or 'Perechoresis' in Greek) based on "Agape Love", which is the foundation of trinitarian relationship. Our God is not an autocratic monster, rather, he is full of love and he gives away his life for others without any selfishness or greed. This trinitarian attribute of God has been acknowledged and glorified in the church through its liturgical tradition. The church and her members must imitate this model of trinity in her communitarian as well as family existence.

Bible as basis of faith and doctrine (Part I - Clause 3)

What is Bible for the Church? Is it something God himself wrote and gave to the people of Faith or is it a record or witness of early believers? Or Can we consider it as a testimony of the people of faith? Yes, a small portion of it Bible was written by God himself (Ex. 32:16), and there are many other portions which God directly uttered to the writers (as in Ezekiel 2:9-10 & Revelations. 21:6). But majority of the writings are from the memory of the people of God, written as a testimony or witness to what they have experienced or witnessed (as in I John 1:1-3). However, unlike the claims of Quran and some part of Hindu Vedas(Sruti), Christians never consider the entire books of the bible to be a document dictated by God to a human agent or uttered in the ears of its writers by

God in secrecy. Rather, Christianity believes that the Bible is the record of the testimony of the people who experienced the work of divine salvation in a unique manner. That is why in I John I:I-3, author writes that, "We declare to you what was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life - this life was revealed, and we have seen it and testify to it". Nevertheless, Paul in 2 Timothy 3:16 wrote that "All scripture is divinely inspired by God". Some other translations used the term, "God breathed" instead of divinely inspired which means, the Scripture is document written by humans in human language and culture, but under the inspiration of Holy Spirit. That is how it becomes the Holy book of faith to the church.

Tradition of the Church (Part I - Clause 3)

The word 'Tradition' derived from the Greek word 'paradosis' whose Latin translation for this word being 'traditio'. In Syriac, it is translated as 'Ahona', meaning handing over of faith' from one person to other or from one generation to the next generation. For instances, Luke I: 2 says "just as they handed on to us by those who from the beginning were eye witnesses and servants of the

word". Paul in 2 Thessalonians 2:15, exhorts the church that, "brothers and sisters, stand firm and hold fast to the traditions that you were taught by us, either by word of mouth or by our letter". Here both Luke and Paul are talking about the Christian tradition concerning Jesus before the formation of the scripture in the form of biblical document. These oral and written proclamation or teachings are popularly known as the apostolic teaching. These apostolic teachings are the contents of Bible today.

Mar Thoma Church is a reformed Eastern Church. Thus. like all other reformed churches. we place the Holy Bible, consisting of sixty-six books, as the basis of all matters concerning doctrine and faith. Thus, for us, Bible is the foundation upon which our faith and practices are built. However, Bible is not the only material or tool available for the church to practice faith and to grow to the stature of lesus Christ. We also do have the written and unwritten 'traditions' of the church, which are complimentary to the Biblical truth and doctrines for the sustenance and growth in Christian life. Nicene Creed, sacraments like Qurbana, Baptism, Marriage, Unction of sick, and other Services are considered as written liturgical traditions of the Church. On the other hand, there are observances of Special days like Sundays, Lents, Dominical

Feasts and other festivals (together known as Christian Calendar) as un-written traditions of the Church. The Sabha Constitution Article-3 concludes with the statement that these liturgies and festivals shall not not be abolished any time siince the Christian Calendar is based on the life and deeds of Christ's life and ministry. Thus, Mar Thoma Church Tradition seriously takes into account the formation and development of faith life of their members.

Catholic Orthodox and churches, however, give equal weightage to tradition along with Bible as the basis for their faith and doctrines. Their argument is based on the fact that Bible itself is part of tradition that evolved within church, and therefore Bible and tradition (both written and unwritten) goes hand-in-hand in the life of Church and its believers. However, Mar Thoma Church does not completely disagree with this argument as there was a period in history, where Bible was not available as it is available today. Then the traditions of the church were considered more important than knowing the biblical truths. Many a times traditions of the church contradicted the Biblical teachings. At this juncture, the reformation of the church began, where the reformers argued for the supremacy of Bible over tradition and the correction or removal of

tradition on the basis of Scriptural truth. Ever since the reformation of the Malankara Church, Mar Thoma Church took into account only those traditions which are in conformity with the Biblical doctrines or truth. Moreover, these traditions are considered as secondary tools, i.e., only next to the bible, for the faith and practices of the church. Mar Thoma Church considers the mentioned liturgical traditions and unwritten traditions as the practical and interpretative application of Biblical truth.

However, we should note that the Pentecostal neo-Pentecostal or Congregational churches are very critical about the old denominations as they all follow traditions (both written and unwritten) handed on to them by the church fathers over centuries. However, if you closely look into the faith and practices of Pentecostal churches, you may observe that these churches too. follow or have developed traditions. such as 'Pentecostal tradition' for the last 500 years which promotes, adult baptism, speaking in tongues, miraculous healing etc. In addition to that, some of the common Christian beliefs such as Bible has 66 books (who finalized this number?), God is in Trinity (do you see this term Trinity in Bible?) observances of Sunday as worship day of Christians (do the Bible say that we should worship God on Sundays?).

From the above we can conclude that, tradition is not bad term as many considers. On the other hand, traditions are essential for any community for its survival and growth. Christians need tradition in addition to the Bible to carry forward the practical aspect of faith to the future generations. However, all traditions must be subject to scrutiny on the basis of Biblical truth.

Ministry of the Church (Part I - Clause 3 & Part II - Clause 5)

Mar Thoma Church has Constitutionally recognized threefold ministries of the church. They are: Episcopa, Priest and Deacon. In the early church, Apostles ordained elders (Presbyteroi in Greek) to tend the flock of God in charge of them (I Peter 5:1). It is from this arrangement that the Office of Presbyter or Priest and Episcopos emerged. Episcopos (Episkpeo) were ordained with the responsibility of overseeing (I Timothy 3:1; Titus 1:7) and Deacons or (Diakonai in Greek) were appointed with general responsibility of the services such as serving the table, preaching the word of God, and serving the needy (Acts 6:2; Acts 11:29; 1 Timothy 3:8-9).

The three-fold ministry in the Constitution does not limit the ministries of the church to three mentioned categories. The

following points may be helpful to understand more about the various ministries and offices in the Church:

- I. The ministry of the church is the continuation of the apostolic ministry of Christ himself (Apostle means 'one who is sent' by God for a mission).
- 2. New Testament gives ample number of evidences for the three-fold character of ministry established in the early church in line with the Ministry of Christ and apostles. They are: Apostolic, priestly, and diakonal. These ministries derived from the character of threefold ministry of Christ viz., Christ the apostle, Christ the High Priest; Christ the servant (diakonos).
- 3. While the whole church is apostolic. having an apostolate or the mission of God to witness to the saving work of God in Christ, there is within them a particular group to perform a specialized task or apostolic ministry of pastoral oversight, preaching, teaching and administering of sacraments (Ephesians 4:11; I Corinthians 12:27-31)
- 4. All ministerial Offices mentioned are the gifts from God to the church to equip the saints for the work of Ministry and for building up the body of Christ (Ephesians 4:12-16)
- 5. All Christian men and women are priests of God (Rev. I:6

- ; 5:10; 20:6). Their priesthood is to and on behalf of the whole creation (1 Peter 2:9).
- 6. Christian ministry is a participation in the work of God (fellow workers of God as mentioned in I Corinthians 3:9), and participation in the diakonia (or servant ministry) of Christ (Mark 10:38; Colossians 1:24).
- 7. The distinctive mark of Christian ministry is servant hood, because the church assumed the role of a servant (Mark 10:45; Philippians 2:7)
- 8. Mar Thoma Church, as reformed eastern church, believes in the 'representative priesthood' (not the mediator priesthood like in Judaism and Catholic faith), i.e., priest is someone who represents the whole ministry of the church.

Mission and goal of the Church (Part I - Clause 4)

Church is a community entitled with the responsibility of ministry and Mission entrusted on her by Christ. As an apostolic (sent out) people, it cannot be an inward looking community, let alone looking after the interest of its members or its body. The ministry of the church is to equip the believers (addressed as saints; Ephesians 4:12-16) to continue the salvific work of God inaugurated in Christ. The aim and purpose of the church is the redemption

of entire creation (i.e., inclusive of humanity and the world; John 3:16 & Romans 8: 18-23). Thus Christ commissioned the church (Matthew 28:18-10 & Acts 1:8) with the responsibility of preaching, teaching and healing (Matthew 4:23; 9:35; 10:5-17). What the church proclaim or do on behalf of Christ or God's Kingdom must be in conformity to the Apostolic teachings and doctrines. Therefore, Christians should have thorough knowledge and firm conviction on Biblical truth and doctrines handed on to them through the apostolic teachings. Church celebrates the

sacraments and preacher teach the the word of God and heal the sick who are afflicted with infirmities, as sign and arrival of the Kingdom of God. All these ministries are done with the power and presence of the Holy Spirit.

Let the above insights on the faith declaration of the church prompt all the readers to go further deep into the history, faith and identity of the church, so that our faith life would be enriched further for the Glory of God and for the redemption of entire creation. May God continue to guide us.

Retreat of Executive Committee & Committees of all Organizations and Prayer groups of our Parish was held on 28.07.2019 at 6 PM at St. Peter's Mar Thoma Church, Pune. Rev. K. P. Johnson, Vicar of Immanuel Mar Thoma church, Vishranthwadi was the key speaker of the retreat session.

The retreat opened with a singing session, followed by prayer and Bible reading. Our Vicar Rev. P.V. Shibu gave the welcome speech, which started with a briefing of the theme of the retreat - "The Parish that worships meaningfully". He then reflected on the achievements of Rev. K.P. Johnson Achen in Vasai Mar Thoma Parish, where he succeeded to establish a participating community through prayer and self-help. Shibu Achen explained that in the modern times worship is losing its real meaning and is becoming monotonous. He emphasized on the need to worship meaningfully.

In his scholarly and thoughtprovoking address Rev. K. P. Johnson established the real meaning of worshiping God. Reminding all present of having divine responsibilities entrusted to them and the need for them to self-introspect. He referred to the now famous email of the CEO of Microsoft- Mr. Satya Nadella sent to his employees about himself. After completion of many years as CEO he writes about the importance of asking ourselves the following auestion -

I) Who am I? 2) Why am I/we here? 3) What do we do next?

David reiterated on the above questions when he was chosen as the new king of Israel. Achen then quoted the example of Joshua who was selected by Moses as his successor. He had forty years of experience with the Israelites in slavery, forty years of life in wilderness and thirty years of life in the promised land. He had

experience, curiosity and hunger for learning and the urge to change the life of the people believing in the importance of living to work for the good of others. As the fighter of independent Israelite, Joshua purified himself so that God remained with him (Joshua 3:6). This faithfulness and obedience to God should be our aim to follow. He even emphasized on the fact that we have lost our leadership abilities not just in our church, but also in our homes. So just as the priests lifted the "Ark of God" and led the people, we too need to lift our 'Ark'- The Bible and hold it close to our hearts and lead our children into doing the same.

Achen reflected on the qualities of Joshua which can help us become good leaders in all walks of our lives:

- I) Man of Humility: He served Moses willingly and did it with humility. In the same way, we are called to serve our Lord and we are asked to do it in a humble way.
- 2) Man of faith: Joshua and Caleb had faith that the promised land could be inherited. So, will all the committee members have faith that all plans and projects undertaken can be accomplished if we work together. What is impossible in our sight is possible in God's sight, as he is the Architect of

our projects.

- 3) Man of God: God gave commands to Moses and he passed those commands to Joshua, which in turn was obeyed by him and he did what he was asked to. How much do we adhere to the word of God?
- 4) Man of Prayer: we need to spend time in prayer even amidst trials. Earlier 'Prayer' was a must, now it's become a choice.
- 5) Man who puts God First: We need to prioritize God above everything else. But we fail to do so in our daily lives.

Lastly, Achen mentioned that we all need to possess these qualities and bring about a change so that we make an impact on other's lives.

The motivational speech of Rev KP Johnson was appreciated by all who attended the meeting. It was an energizing experience.

The retreat concluded by the 'Vote of thanks' by the Vice President of St Peter's Mar Thoma Church, Mr. E.P Jacob followed by dinner.
